The Emerald Isle

I wondered how I might pull off a trip to Ireland less than a month before our BIG day, but I'd always wanted to visit Ireland. Once in Dublin, I visited Saint Patrick's Cathedral (of course) and took a tour of Trinity College. But on my last night, I walked a few blocks down the street from my Bed & Breakfast to the famous Abbey Theatre to take in a show. Although the show was notable and all the attractions of my trip were a treat in themselves, Ireland fascinated me more for its sights, sounds, culture, and a bounty of heartwarming charm.

There's an old Irish Proverb that says, "Now sweetly lies old Ireland, Emerald Green beyond the foam, awakening sweet memories, calling the heart back home." This certainly rings true for me. As I headed home after ten, idyllic days in Ireland - I felt as if part of my heart was left behind in the Emerald Isle.

- ◇ Don't send money by wire or prepaid debit to someone you don't know or haven't met yet.
- ◇ Don't send money to someone who claims to be in an emergency unless you know them and can verify they are genuine

Irish Beef and Spinach Shepherd's Pie

Ingredients: 2 lb. Russet potatoes (about 4), peeled and cubed; kosher salt; 1 lb. lean ground beef; 1 medium yellow or white onion, diced; 2 carrots, peeled and diced; 2 ribs celery, diced; 2 cloves garlic, minced; 2 tsp. fresh thyme leaves; 2 tsp. chopped fresh rosemary; Freshly ground black pepper; 3 tbsp. tomato paste; 1 c. chicken broth; 4 c. baby spinach; 1 c. milk

Directions:

1. Place potatoes in a medium saucepan and cover with cold water. Season with salt. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer until tender, 12 to 15; drain and return to pan.
2. Meanwhile, in a large skillet over medium-high heat, brown beef, breaking it up with a wooden spoon, 5 minutes. Add onion, carrots, celery, garlic, thyme, and rosemary and cook until vegetables are soft, 5 minutes. Spoon out and discard any extra grease in pan and season with salt and pepper. Stir in tomato paste and chicken broth; let simmer until liquid reduces slightly, 3 to 4 minutes. Stir in spinach until wilted, 2 to 3 minutes.
3. Preheat broiler to high. Add milk to drained potatoes and bring to a simmer. Using a potato masher or fork, mash potatoes until smooth. Stir in olive oil and season with salt and pepper.
4. Spoon beef and spinach mixture into a medium-sized baking dish and spoon mashed potatoes on top. Use a fork to create texture on top (the potatoes will brown better) and drizzle with olive oil.
5. Broil until nicely browned on top, 2 to 3 minutes. Serve immediately with a green salad.

Quick Tips from Your #1 Protection Team



Certain categories of personal property, although covered by standard homeowners insurance, are subject to *special limits of liability* that are much lower than the overall Coverage C limit (Personal Property under your Home policy). Property items included in these categories for the most part are of potentially high value (Jewelry, Firearm Collections,

Money, etc) of compact and readily portable form, and are attractive to thieves.

As an example, most Home policies will limit Jewelry to \$1,500-\$2,500 in coverage. If you have more extensive amounts of jewelry, you should consider adding Jewelry separately under an **Inland Marine Floater**.

Firearms and guns, silverware, watercraft, gold (and silver) bullion, and money all have similar restrictions.

 A new analysis of a study of the effectiveness of the drug Praxil for treating troubled teenagers conducted more than 10 years ago— says it arrived at the wrong conclusions. The original study found that the drug was safe and effective, whereas the latest review notes that the drug can make some teenagers

suicidal. Although the review is new, concerns about the drug are well established and clear warnings have been placed on the product labels for some time.

 Car price guide publisher Kelley Blue Book has announced its five favorite new car safety features. They are: 1) Backup cameras; 2) Forward collision alerts that sound when you're in danger of rear-ending someone; 3) Side mirror warning lights that illuminate when there's a vehicle in your blind spot; 4) Lane departure warnings that issue an alert when a car drifts from a lane; 5) Voice-controlled navigation, phone, entertainment, and texting.
